<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RECOGNIZE the presence of a hazard - Identify the nature of the emergency by observing the situation. • Keep in mind that the emergency may be growing. • Stay alert to the presence of danger such as fire, downed power lines, hazardous chemicals, or criminal activity. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AVOID becoming a victim. Your first step in an emergency must be to look around and ask yourself, "Is the scene safe for me?" • Too often well-intentioned rescuers become victims themselves when they risk their safety to help others. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ISOLATE hazards by securing the area. • Fire doors may be used to help contain a fire as well as support containment of a security threat, chemical release, or infectious area. • Take steps to preserve the area and protect the safety of others. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NOTIFY 9-1-1 to report the emergency.
